El Cumbanchero (tempo change represents going up/down mountain,

high lyrical noting represents drinking water)

Call To The Post (formal fanfare represents coming to attention)

Bugle Call Rag (harmonics sound like bugle call)

Foggy Mountain Breakdown (fast tempo represents racing horse)

Banjo Techniques: Explain and demonstrate

harmonic slide hammer on pull off bend

Assessment: Ask for response to various musical examples.
